

Severe Weather impacts Sikeston Community

Severe weather came through much of the lower half of the State of Missouri on Sunday, impacting multiple communities including Sikeston. From Shelby and Butler Ave. through E. Gladys St. and Virginia St. up to Garwood and Kinder Ave., people's homes were severely damaged by wind, flying debris, and fallen trees. Large parts of the city lost power. The American Red Cross of Missouri was contacted Sunday by local emergency management officials and arrived that afternoon to provide shelter for those in need. The shelter was established at the YMCA on Taylor St. In addition to providing shelter, Red Cross teams will be out in the community conducting preliminary damage assessments to determine the extent of the damage and community assistance needs. Teams will also distribute emergency clean-up supplies such as tarps, rakes, totes, and more water to the impacted communities in the days to come.
