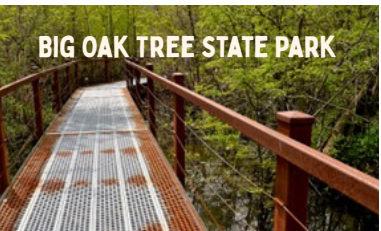

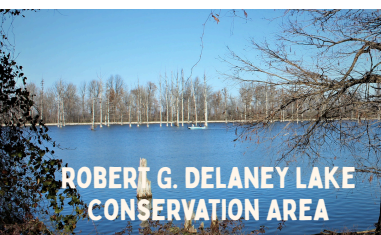
This Scott County Conservation Area features hiking, hunting, primitive camping, picnicking, and fishing opportunities (nine fishable lakes and ponds). Hwy 77, Oran MO, (573) 290-5730



Tywappity Community Lake is located in Scott County. The area now consists of 147 acres of woodland and 37 acres of surface water. A large grassy area near the lake has a pavilion, grills, and picnic tables. A boat ramp and privies are also provided. Handicap accessible. Restrooms available.
